Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Greetings in the Lord! I pray you are all well, and the new year goes well for you.

I want to address the matter of Holy Communion. All the Mysteries (Sacraments) of the Church are vitally important. Supreme among these is the Divine Liturgy, which is the vehicle for Holy Communion. When we talk about whether we are in communion with other Christians or not, it means can we and do we share the Holy Gifts, the Body and Blood of Christ or not? The Divine Liturgy is the only Mystery/Sacrament that is repeated. It is of such supreme and vital importance, that we must be totally sure that we approach it in a right, proper and positive spirit and manner. To properly receive Holy Communion, you must be at peace in yourself and with your brethren. You cannot and must not approach the Chalice with anger, arrogance, contempt, judgement, or other negative thoughts and emotions. To do so is to invite judgement from God upon ourselves. To do so can also make you weak, sick, and dark. To do so is to show contempt for Christ. This is the teaching of the Orthodox Church.

However, having said all that (as advice and warning), we do not have to be perfect to receive Communion, because none of us are. We just have to repent, or at least trying to do so, plus be at peace in heart and mind, and with those around us. Then, we receive forgiveness, strength, blessing and healing.

Life is short, in the Light of Eternity. Someday, we will all die, leave the earth, and go on. The Sufis have a saying: "Die before you die." Prepare now for death by living fully and positively, taking every opportunity to rid ourselves of darkness and negativity. Then, when it comes our time to die, it will be light, peaceful, joyous and easy - rather than incredibly dark, painful and difficult. Sort out your issues now while it is relatively easy to do so. Make peace with God, as well as with your brothers and sisters, while you have these blessed opportunities. The choice is yours. Choose wisely and well.

OUR ASSESSMENT TO THE ARCHDIOCESE: Holy Apostles was one of the 71 churches (out of 484) that took part in it in the Total Commitment Prepayment Program which raised over \$2.4 million in allocations. That support was critical to the Archdiocese meeting pressing obligations early in 2019 and help the Archdiocese in paying off the \$2 million line of credit by June 30, 2019. Remember that our obligation is \$3000 to the Archdiocese.
